



The AGAPE Counseling Department exists to provide empirically validated behavioral health treatment to children, teenagers, adults, couples, and families presenting with a variety of emotional and interpersonal concerns in a manner that is consistent with AGAPE's Mission and Statement of Faith.

Position Title: Counselor, Full-Time

Reports To: Clinical Director

Hours/Shift: 40 hours per week with specific work schedule to be determined. At least one evening per week is expected.

Purpose: To provide direct behavioral health services to clients of a wide range of ages and presenting concerns, including intake, treatment plan development, and follow-up counseling services.

Duties and Responsibilities:

Direct Services: Provides initial intake assessments, conduct treatment planning, schedule and complete follow-up visits, and conduct safety assessments as needed. May provide direct counseling services for children placed in foster care, as well. May provide direct counseling services via in-person and telehealth.

Administrative: Completes all clinical documentation in a timely manner, including intake documents, follow-up progress notes, and discharge summaries. Makes appropriate referrals to appropriate internal and external resources. Report safety issues to appropriate authorities or resources for assistance.

Reporting: Documents client interactions and treatment-related activities into the electronic health records system. Communicates regularly with Clinical Director and supervisor (if applicable).

Qualifications:

Must be a competent behavioral health professional with excellent interpersonal and communication skills (both verbal and written), adhering to the ethics of the counseling professions. Must be able to demonstrate excellent clinical judgment, cultural sensitivity, and collaboration with team members across departments.

Qualifications Include:

- Holds Tennessee licensure in Clinical Mental Health Counseling, Marital and Family Therapy, Social Work, or Psychology. Post-graduate clinicians working toward licensure under supervision may also be considered.
- Experience working with children, teenagers, adults, couples, and families.

- Experience with a wide range of client presenting concerns (e.g., depression, anxiety, ADHD, family or work-related stress, grief, etc.).
- Experience with delivery of clinical services via telehealth platforms.
- Proficient in common computer/software applications, such as MS Office, Word, and Excel.

AGAPE's Purpose:
